Sat. June 20, McKellar Twp.: Threats

– OPP investigated threats made at a camp in McKellar Twp. after a male had an altercation with another male and left the scene. John Cuffe, 44, of Carling Twp. was arrested and charged with impaired driving, drive over 80 mgs, fail to remain at the scene of an accident, utter threats and breach of probation.

Sat, June 20, McDougall Twp.: Impaired driving - OPP received two complaints of a vehicle driving all over the road near George Hunter Memorial Dr. in McDougall Twp., Mark Jensen, 44, Bracebridge, was arrested and charged with impaired driving and drive over 80 mgs.

Fri. June 19, Huntsville: Window damaged – Shortly after midnight, culprits threw a beer bottle at a house on Brunel Rd., shattering a window. The bottle landed on a bed of a sleeping child who was not injured although the bed was covered in glass.

Fri. June 19, Parry Sound: Impaired driving – After a vehicle was observed driving all over the road on Hwy. 124 near Parry Sound, OPP charged Douglas McGahey, 49, with impaired driving and drive over 80 mgs.

Fri. June 19, Huntsville: B&E – Sometime overnight, culprits broke into the patio area of the Cottage Bar and Grill on John St. and got away with a few cases of beer.

Thurs. June 18, Huntsville: Trailer rollover – The trailer detached from the truck and rolled onto the sidewalk on Main St. E. in front of Tim Horton, damaging a nearby fence. Driver Donald Godfrey, 41, of St. Catharines was not injured.

Wed. June 17, Burk's Falls: Drug possession – An OPP search of a residence on Ontario St. in Burk's Falls led to the arrest of Dylan Armstrong, 28, and Stacy Pratt, 20, of Burk's Falls. Armstrong was charged with possession for the purpose of trafficking, possession of controlled substance (x2) and breach of probation. Pratt was charged with possession of controlled drugs (x2) and possession for the purpose of trafficking.

Mon. June 15, Huntsville: B&E – About 4am, OPP noticed a smashed window at Mac's Milk on Minerva St. and saw persons inside the store. Kyle Ball, 22, and Roger Carpenter, 26, both of Huntsville, were arrested and charged with break and enter. Ball was also charged with breach of probation.

Mon. June 15, Bracebridge: Drug possession – Around 2am, OPP stopped a 1994 Acura Integra on Hwy 11, observed marijuana in the vehicle and arrested the three occupants. With the assistance of the K-9 unit, a quantity of cocaine was also found. Estimated street value of the seized drugs is over \$4,900. Jonas Michel Plouffe, 19, Maxime Marcel Dufresne, 19 and Justin Hansen, 18, all of Temiscaming, Quebec are charged with possession of a controlled substance for the purposes of trafficking and two charges of possession of a controlled substance.

ATV ride safe

When you think you're ready to hit the ATV trails, make sure you've completed your pre-trip inspection.

Check for twigs or rocks that may have become lodged in the frame; steering for excessive play and test suspension components; tighten the wheels, check tire pressure and wear; listen for excessive wheel and brake noise.

Check battery has sufficient cranking power and that the throttle and choke operate smoothly; running lights and brake lights. Ensure the license plate is properly affixed.

Always operate your machine in a safe and responsible manner. Inexperienced riders operating a borrowed machine may drive beyond their capabilities with catastrophic results. An older style three-wheeled machine can easily become unstable and flip causing serious injury or death. Alcohol and speed often factor in ATV crashes. Quite simply, the responsibility for ATV maintenance, operation and trail safety sits squarely on the shoulders of the operator.

In 2009 one ATV death has already occurred.

Between June 2 and 9, culprit(s) stole three paint ball rifles, 200 paint balls, a camping cooler, two-gallon gas can with fuel, a paddleboat and a fish finder.

Benoit Rocheleau, 46, of Bearn, Quebec was charged with operating a motor vehicle while exceeding 80 milligrams of blood alcohol under the CCC and having care and control of a motor vehicle with open liquor under the LLA.

Thurs. June 11, Huntsville: Attempted armed robbery – OPP is seeking public assistance to locate an attempted robbery suspect. About 12:20am, a female near the Royal Bank at Main St. and West St. was approached by a male who demanded money. When she hesitated, the male wielded an edged weapon and demanded money again, but left when a vehicle drove by. The suspect is described as 5'9" with shoulder length blonde curly hair and wearing a black baseball cap, dark sweater and baggy pants. Wed. June 10, Huntsville: B&E – Between June 10 and June 13, culprits entered a cottage on North Deer Lake Rd. and removed several items including a television, table saw, mitre saw, tool pack and DVD player.

Mon. June 8, Armour Twp.: Home invasion – On June 8, OPP investigated a home invasion robbery on Berriedale Road in Armour Twp. On June 18, Dylan Armstrong, 28, of Burk's Falls was arrested in connection with this crime. Armstrong has been charged with robbery, forcible confinement and breach of probation.

Fri. June 5 & Tues. June 9, Huntsville: Thefts – Overnight on June 5, culprits entered vehicles in the areas of Brunel Rd. and the Riverside subdivision and took a purse, wallet, sunglasses and loose change. The night of June 9, vehicles were entered in the area of Hart Ct. and Southdale Dr. and wallets and loose change were taken. OPP asks the public to take personal belongings into their residence and lock vehicles overnight.

Sun. May 31, Huntsville: B&E – Sometime between May 31 and June 5, culprits broke into a cottage on Buckhorn Lake and removed several items including power tools, chainsaws, a 52" LCD flat screen and a DVD player. The cottage's alarm system was not working at the time of the break in.
