Mon. Feb 1, Huntsville: Arrests made in

Fall B&E – Dirk Vanheerenm 18, of Huntsville and a male young offender were charged with theft under, and break and enter a place to commit an indictable offence under the CCC in connection with a break and enter at a

garage on Lynx Lake Rd. and two dirt bikes were removed.

Mon. Feb. 1, Huntsville: Sled theft - A theft took place at Deerhurst Resort over the weekend of a black 2004 Arctic Cat ZR800 (New York Registration of 7574FT) parked on a trailer in the resort's parking lot.

Sun. Jan. 31, Bracebridge: Impaired - In the early morning hours OPP observed a car driving erratically on Dominion St. Police suspected the driver might be impaired and attempted to stop the car. Police were able to safely stop the car but the driver refused to provide a breath sample. Darryl Dukoff 51, is charged with Impaired Operation of a motor vehicle, Refusal to provide a breath sample into Approved Instrument and Failing to Stop for Police.

Sat. Jan. 30, Port Sydney: Snowmobile Crash -

Sometime overnight, a 39-year-old Port Sydney male was traveling on the OFSC trail D103B when he struck a tree. The man was found before 10am by other snowmobilers. The man was transported to Huntsville Hospital then airlifted to Sunnybrook Medical Centre in Toronto.

Sat. Jan. 30, Huntsville: Second snowmobile crash -

Around 12:30pm, officers attended OFSC trail D near Stephenson Rd 4 where a 43-year-old female from Mississauga had lost control of her sled, drove off the trail and struck a tree. The driver was not injured as a result of the crash.

Fri. Jan. 29, Huntsville: Snow machines stolen -

Between 1am and 4am, culprits went onto the front yard of a residence on Brunel Rd. where an orange Bombardier Skidoo was chained to a tree. The chain was cut the 2002 Bombardier Olympic Edition 800cc machine with Ontario plate 921200 removed. On the same day, OPP received information about a snow blower stolen from a garage on N. Ril Lake Rd.

Thurs. Jan. 28, Huntsville: B&E - Between Jan. 28 and Jan. 31, culprits broke into a shed at a residence on Aspdin Rd. and took a Honda 3500 watt generator and a 12" Stihl quick saw.

Tues. Jan. 26, Bracebridge: Shoplifter arrested - OPP officers tracked down and arrested a woman who shoplifted a winter coat at Mark's Work Wearhouse around noon. The woman bought a few items but left without paying for the coat. Officers arrived at the store within moments of receiving a report of the theft. Using video surveillance and information from staff, officers established a suspect. Charged with theft and possession of property obtained by crime is Claudine Couture, 47, of Bracebridge.

Fenbrook visitor charged

A woman is been charged after an estimated \$10,000 in drugs was seized in a visitor search at Fenbrook prison last week.

Correctional Service Canada spokesperson Annette Allen said the "unusually large" seizure included 49 oxycontin tablets, 8.5 grams of a rock-like substance, 1.8 grams of marijuana – and 1.3 grams of tobacco (enough for two small cigarettes).

Tobacco is considered contraband, as smoking is not allowed in the federal prison institution.

The estimated "institutional value" of the seizure is \$10,000, according to the prison's security intelligence unit.

Allen said the value inside the prison can be double or more, depending on the outside street price of the contraband, including cigarettes.

A further search of the woman's vehicle produced additional drug paraphernalia.

Allen said a drug pipe and more drugs were also found. CSC has a number of tools that are consistently used in efforts to control the flow of drugs into our institutions – including drug-sniffing dogs.

Part of a routine search before entering the prison is the use of an "ion scanner" that involves using a swab of say a belt buckle or shoe, which is analysed by a test machine for traces of drugs.

Prison officials also conduct searches of buildings and cells.

Visitations are conducted in a large common area, under video surveillance. That could be where any transfer of drugs or contraband is made.

Allen said large drug seizures like this aren't common; but small amounts are not uncommon – such as a single joint.

Allen said this proves prison detection methods work.

Prison staff at Fenbrook and the minimum security Beaver Creek Institution next door remind citizens that there is a toll-free telephone line, 1(866)780-3784 or (705)687-1999, for reporting any pressure to which a visitor may be subjected by other visitors and/or inmates involved in drug trafficking, intimidation, assault and loan sharking. Such information is treated with confidentiality, and a security intelligence officer will provide follow-up.

The OPP was contacted and charges have been laid against the visitor.

As a result, the OPP has charged Cassandra Menard, 30, of Keswick, with possession of cocaine for the purpose of trafficking, possession of other drugs for the purpose of trafficking and possession of marijuana.

Overnight, culprits broke open the rear door of a residence on Centre St. S. and removed a quantity of cash, jewellery and a coin collection along with other items.

Sun. Jan. 24, Huntsville: B & E - Sometime during January, culprits entered a condo on Turner Dr. and removed miscellaneous electronics, including three televisions, DVD players and a play station.

Sat. Jan. 23, Magnetawan: Fatal sled accident - OPP are investigating a fatal snowmobile collision that occurred about 2:30am on Poverty Bay Rd. The accident claimed the life of Jeffrey Carroll, 29, of Vittoria, ON when the sled he was driving struck a tree along the shoreline. Carroll and several friends had been out snowmobiling on the river prior to the collision.

Sat. Jan. 23, Huntsville: More snow machines stolen -

OPP is investigating a break and enter on Muskoka Bob Rd. in the Twp. of Lake of Bays that occurred sometime during January. Culprits broke into a locked garage and removed a snow blower. Police also investigated the theft of a Northtrail trailer with Ontario licence plate H77258, and a 1996 Skidoo MXZ with Ontario licence plate 774767 on Lakeview Cres. in Huntsville.

Arrest made in masked robbery

On Jan. 15, just before 10 p.m., the victim reported that, while pulling off the road to answer a cellphone, a male dressed in black, wearing a ski mask opened the passenger side of the vehicle.

A second male approached the driver's side of the vehicle also. After a brief conversation, the culprits made off with a purse that was in the back seat of the vehicle. The suspects fled in a pickup truck, possibly an older model Dodge, black in colour.

On Jan. 23, three males were arrested as a result of the investigation. Michael Coles, 28, Charles Jenner, 28, and Graeme Kelly, 33, of Huntsville were arrested and eventually charged with Robbery. Coles and Kelly face additional charges of Disguise with Intent all under the CCC. All three will appear in Huntsville court at a later date to answer to their charges.

The investigation is continuing and anyone with any information pertaining to this event is encouraged to contact Huntsville OPP or Crime Stoppers.
